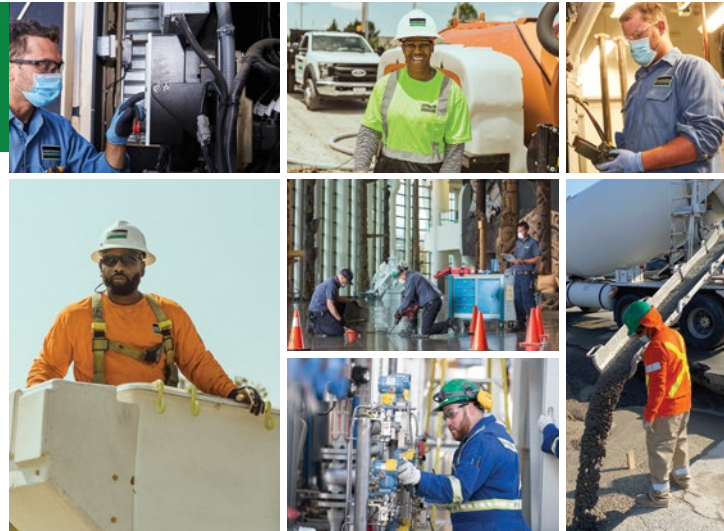

Black & McDonald Builds COVID-19 Tent Cities for Hospitals in Toronto and Hamilton

Black & McDonald's (B&M) Service team recently worked on a major COVID-19-related project with Aggreko Canada. Aggreko had supply contracts for installing power cabling for temporary 80-bed COVID-19 intensive care units at Sunnybrook Hospital in Toronto, ON, and at Hamilton General Hospital in Hamilton, ON. These mobile units were designed to accommodate and treat overflow patients infected with the virus. Each was the size of a football field and was able to handle up to 100 patients.

Our service team supported the projects at both locations, deploying journeymen and various trade apprentices from multiple offices, including the Hamilton and Pullman Court locations. All in all, B&M installed 210,000 ft. of cable at Sunnybrook and 75,000 ft. of cable at Hamilton General.

We began our work by grounding ten 500 kW generators that would provide power for the hospitals. The generators were set up in two groups of five generators each. Each set of five worked in parallel to provide 4,000 A at 600 V to the two main switchboards. It was from these switchboards that the transfer switches, transformers and individual distribution panels located closer to the hospital tents were fed. The distribution panels provided power to the individual electrical panels located inside the tent structures. Our teams installed the transfer switches between the two groups of generators to allow the transfer of loads from one to the other in case of any failures. Due to the large number of cables running from the generators to the main switchboards and then out, B&M erected a scaffolding system around the tents in order to keep the cables off the ground and away from foot traffic.

"It was the first time we've ever been involved in something like this. We were an integral part of building hospitals from the ground up in parking lots, including ICU units and specialized patient areas," explained David Fleming, Electrical Operations Supervisor, GTA Service.

"From start to finish these projects took three and a half weeks to complete. The clients expressed their pleasure at how we executed the tasks and said they look forward to working with us again in the future."



B&M Awarded Major Design-Build Contract for Novelis Heavy Industrial Plant

Black & McDonald (B&M) is proud to have been recently awarded a design-build contract by Novelis, the world's largest producer of rolled aluminum sheeting, for a new primary 115 kV electrical service for their heavy industrial plant in Oswego, New York.

The Novelis Oswego facility is also the thermal and electrical host to an adjacent 1,100 MW natural gas, steam and electric power generation facility, one of the largest combined cycle power plants in the state of New York, which is owned by Vistra and known as the Independence Power Plant.

Our partnership with Novelis started in 2020, when we were selected to perform a construction management services contract to oversee the engineering, procurement and construction deliverables for the client on this project, and our role then rapidly evolved to that of a turnkey EPC contractor responsible for executing the full scope of work.

In the early stages of the construction management contract, B&M identified an opportunity to reduce costs for the owner and improve scheduling by offering a full engineering, balance of procurement, construction and testing, and commissioning scope of work on an unsolicited basis. We worked directly with the Novelis stakeholders at multiple levels to develop a single-contract approach on a firm fixed price EPC basis that met the planned budgeting requirements.

These efforts led to the turnkey contract for the electrical infrastructure project, which involves grid connection planned in April 2022 and coordination of outages and tie-ins with National Grid, a major utility company, and also with the adjacent Independence Power Plant.

B&M's contract includes the performance of eight primary scope of work items, currently in progress under a design-build contract:

1. Providing multi-discipline engineering of a six-breaker ring bus 115 kV substation and a new 13.8 kV power system involving five exiting feeders
2. Providing multi-discipline engineering of a two-circuit 115 kV power system involving an underground 115 kV XLPE cable system and an overhead 115 kV OH line



3. Providing multi-discipline engineering of a fibre-optic communication system which will interconnect the adjacent 1,100 MW natural gas power generation system and the new substation, involving upgrades at the Independence Power Plant 345 kV switchyard
4. Providing balance of procurement
5. Providing full construction
6. Providing full testing and commissioning
7. Decommissioning an existing 115 kV oil circuit breaker yard
8. Decommissioning an existing 115 kV / 13.8 kV end of life substation at the facility

As of December 8, 2021, one 115 kV underground circuit has been installed, tested and energized. The high-voltage substation is approximately 90 percent completed and the medium voltage cables exiting the substation have been installed. B&M will be receiving the control building in January 2022, finishing the control cable installation during the winter of 2022 and will be self-performing the commissioning with its high-voltage technicians to allow for an April 2022 online date per the original schedule.

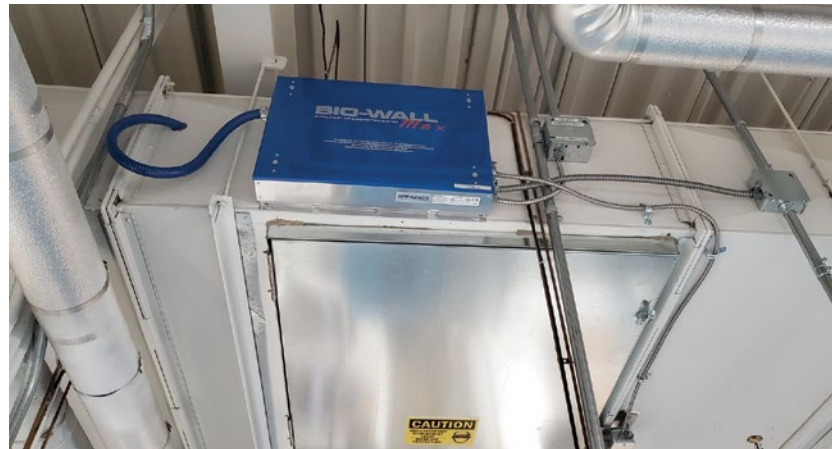
Black & McDonald Upgrades Five Hospitals' HVAC and Indoor Air Quality Equipment in Eastern Newfoundland

Black & McDonald (B&M) has been working directly with Honeywell Energy Services Group since February 2020 to upgrade HVAC efficiency and improve Indoor Air Quality (IAQ) at five healthcare sites in eastern Newfoundland.

Work at all the sites—St. Clare's Mercy Hospital in St. John's; the Dr. LA Miller Centre in St. John's; the Dr. Walter Templeman Health Care Centre in Bell Island; the Placentia Health Centre in Placentia; and the GB Cross Memorial Hospital in Clarenville—required creative planning and execution. These upgrades took on additional complexity, relevance and urgency once the COVID-19 pandemic became a potential threat to patients, hospital staff and the B&M team.

Our technicians made many upgrades designed to optimize the HVAC systems and increase their operational efficiency. These upgrades included installing new zone control dampers, high-efficiency fan motors, and variable frequency drives at multiple sites. For example, there was a complete overhaul of the mechanical penthouse at the Dr. Walter Templeman Health Care Centre.

Corporate HSE Update – Black & McDonald Named Canada's Safest Utilities and Electrical Employer

This prestigious recognition is just one of many different awards we have won over the years and a strong reflection of our commitment to the highest standards of health and safety.

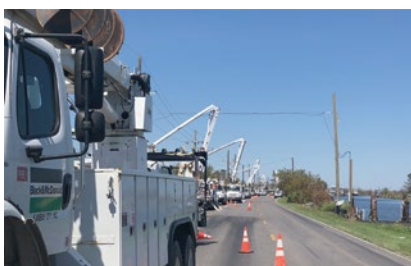
At B&M, safety is at the heart of everything we do. We believe that every safety incident is preventable, and that the goal of zero incidents is achievable.



Black & McDonald's Kansas City Utilities Team Restores Services to Louisiana Territory Struck by Hurricane Ida

Black & McDonald's Utilities team in Kansas City is currently assisting Entergy with restoration efforts in their southern Louisiana service territory, which sustained significant damages in the aftermath of Hurricane Ida, a Category 4 storm that made landfall in August. The Kansas City team sent 14 distribution line crews, with a total of 60 FTEs to provide assistance. Crews from Central Kansas, the Kansas City Metro Area, and the St. Louis Metro Area went to assist.

Ida caused significant outages across Entergy's service territory with approximately 1 million customers impacted. Ida's landfall coincided with the 16th anniversary of Hurricane Katrina's striking southeast Louisiana and Mississippi in 2005. Hurricane Ida ties with Hurricane Laura (2020) and the Last Island Hurricane (1856) as the strongest hurricanes to ever hit Louisiana.

Black & McDonald Upgrades Five Hospitals' HVAC and Indoor Air Quality Equipment in Eastern Newfoundland

The scope included a new custom air handling unit, with a high-efficiency ECM fan wall and HEPA filters, steam-to-steam humidifier, and replacement of the outdated electrical panel. At St. Clare's Mercy Hospital, an all-new heat recovery system was installed. The system is designed to absorb waste heat from the building's exhaust air and use the energy to pre-heat the fresh air intake during colder months. At -16 °C outdoors, the system is expected to transfer over 275 kW of energy.

In addition to improving energy efficiency, the B&M team made key upgrades to the sites' IAQ, using UV-C lighting to destroy mould, viruses, bacteria and carbon-based odours. The lighting was mounted in air ducts to disinfect passing air as well as inside air handling units to prevent germ growth on the cooling coils.

Improving IAQ was a goal that the hospitals wanted to achieve even before the pandemic hit. Thanks to the UV-C updates made by B&M, 99.99% of bio-contaminants in the air ducts

and on cooling coils were eradicated. They will continue to remain clean as long as the lighting stays on.

B&M's team of technicians began work just before the pandemic struck. It was an unforeseen challenge that would time and again interfere with the clients' schedules and our own.

“We were all prepared for our tasks and ready to go when COVID-19 hit and everything changed,” said Craig Ward, project manager for all five job sites. “We had many supply issues due to a lack of material availability. The longest delay we faced was with St. Clare's, where we had a five-month interruption.”

Ward said the team did everything it could to take the projects as far forward as possible before demobilizing. Throughout the time that work was on hold, the team made sure that the clients were regularly updated and stayed involved with what was going on. They were ultimately pleased with the team's performance, despite the difficult circumstances.

“We have now started to work directly with the Eastern Health Regional Authority to recommend and secure additional work to improve the function of the existing HVAC systems,” said Ward. “We expect that this relationship will last beyond the duration of these projects.”

CBO Employee Commissioned by Major Defense Client to Build Unique Table for Departing Commander

A raised surface in tempered glass was installed to allow medals and coins to be placed on top of the table while being protected.

"I had done a few minor projects for the Drill Sergeant Major, but I had never done something of this size," Vaughan said. "It was extremely fun to do. It was just a side project that allowed me to branch out into a new field of woodworking."

Black & McDonald's New Brunswick Utility Division Blazes Trail in Atlantic Region

With capabilities to work on the full spectrum of low-voltage 208 V all the way to high-voltage 500 kV equipment, B&M is well placed to continue offering services to existing and new customers.

"The market in New Brunswick does not have a lot of competition, and we do not have to sub out work to a third party," said Troy Nauss, Division Manager, NB Utility. "We can do everything in-house. When clients do the cost analysis it just makes perfect sense."

B&M is especially attractive to potential clients in New Brunswick thanks to its safety record. In October, B&M was recognized as Canada's Safest Utilities and Electrical Employer for 2021 by Canada's Safest Employers, the leading independent awards program in the occupational health and safety industry.

"Our reputation for being an industry leader in safety is a great asset for our substation construction team, enabling us to offer an attractive, full turnkey package to clients at the bidding stage and secure future maintenance work," said Jason Caissie, Department Manager, NB Utility.

NB Utility has worked on a number of prestigious projects:

- Upgrading FEC essential power with a new 400 kW generator at the Saint John Airport, which has an estimated economic impact of \$68.7 million a year.
- Upgrading distribution lines and poles at the Fredericton Research and Development Centre, which is nearly 120 years old and one of Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada's network of 20 research and development sites.
- Winning the Burchill Substation construction project contract for Saint John Energy, part of a multi-phase wind energy project supplying 42 MW of power to Saint John's electrical grid.



Caissie said he was excited by the direction B&M's regional utility division is going in and that the future looks bright.

"We are going to continue serving existing customers we already do work for in other divisions," said Caissie. "Plus, because we're in field services, we'll be doing work for substations and high-profile customers in the Atlantic region, including Saint John Energy, NB Power, Nova Scotia Power and PEI Energy."
